

Equipment activity

The PPE activity focussed on **five** commonly used categories of equipment: dynamic ropes, sit-harnesses, connectors (carabiners), mountaineering helmets and energy absorbing systems for via ferrata climbing (climbing on a route with a fixed climbing installation including a safety line).



PPE are products that the user can wear or hold, to be protected against risks either at work, at home or whilst engaging in leisure activities





Following the outcome of the risk assessment, the MSAs withdrew 30 unsafe products from the market and instigated 20 recalls.
