OBJECTIVES

Support the implementation of Reg (EU) 2019/1020 and remove non-compliant products from the Single Market

Results and Recommendations

Machines (WM Washing

MSAs inspected documents for 46 models; 34 (74%) were non-compliant, mostly due to missing information. 5 of the 8 models tested (75%) had presumed non-compliances. One model has been triple tested.




Economic operators who import models under their private label should be aware that in doing this they become the responsible economic operator in meeting the regulatory requirements.








12 of the 14 cabinets tested were non-compliant. Some of the issues were related to declared storage volume, temperature attainment or excess energy consumption. MSAs checked documentation for 60 models, 36% of which were not meeting the Energy Labelling requirements. If a supplier relies on a test report or other evidence of compliance for its rebranded product with a different model number, then a formal 'Declaration of Identity' (signed by the original manufacturer) should be prepared to prove that the evidence is valid for the rebranded product.




