Harmonisation



MSAs in the field of ecodesign and electrical safety shared their knowledge and expertise in identifying and evaluating the risks of non-compliance. They also created a joint guidance document for risk assessment and corrective measure.

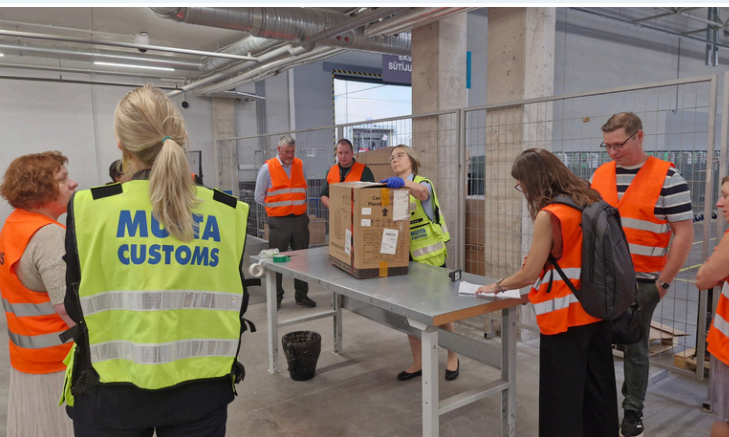


MSAs exchanged strategic and operational aspects of market surveillance, screening and testing product, cooperation with Customs and risk assessment. 9 out of the 10 MSAs participating have implemented the lessons learnt in their own internal processes.

Take aways



The Action showed that MSAs with different legal remit are consistent in the corrective actions they take towards economic operators, but major variations exist in the imposition of fines.
