# Power Tools (rough)

- (impact) Drills
- Saws (circular, reciprocating, chain, band, bench, mitre, combined mitre bench),
- Planers,
- Sanders,
- Grinders,
- Strapping tools and jointers,
- Shears, nibblers and hammers,
- Routers, tackers and trimmers.
- Screw drivers and impact wrenches,





## Main risks

- The main hazards associated with power tools include the following:
  - Cuts, abrasions, punctures;
  - Electric shock, electrocution, burns;
  - Heat, sparks (fire);
  - Dust/flying particles (eyes);
  - Entrapment of clothing, etc.;
  - Sprains and strains (wrist, hand, arm, shoulder);
  - Noise (hearing);
  - Vibration ("white fingers").





## **RAPEX** notifications

• There have been a significant number of RAPEX notifications in past 5 years e.g. 9 saws, 9 angle grinders, 5 hard bladed cutter accessories for grass trimmers, for powered hand tools, particularly those with cutting blades.





## Applied definition 'Power Tools'

#### Electric powered

- handheld and/or transportable tools available in the 'do it yourself (DIY)' market,
- including different accessories (e.g. for cutting if appropriate for that specific type of tool).

## Relevant Directive/standards

Machinery Directive 2006/42/EC (MD)
 with their harmonized standards.

Compliance with those standards provide a presumption of conformity with the specified essential requirements of the machinery directive

Risk-protection to electricity supply is included in MD annex1 but follow the LVD requirements





## Relevant Directive/standards

• Directive 2004/108/EC relating to the electromagnetic compatibility with their harmonized standards.

Compliance with those standards provide a presumption of conformity with the specified essential requirements of the EMC directive (e.g.

**EN 50370-1: 2005** Product family standard for machine tools - Emission and **EN 50370-2: 2005** Product family standard for machine tools - Immunity).





# Relevant harmonized standards to the Machinery directive for Power Tools

- EN 60745 part 1 and parts 2) which covers both mains and battery powered hand held electric tools.
- EN 61029 part 1 and parts 2 Transportable motor-operated electric tools
- EN 62841 part 1, parts 2 and parts 3 Electric motor operated hand held tools, transportable tools & lawn and garden machinery (not harm.) and also EN ISO standards (EN ISO 11806 part 1 and 2).





# Relevant Commission guidance

Commission Decision 2012/32/EU requiring Member States to prohibit the placing on the market of flail-type cutting attachments for portable hand-held brush cutters- trimmers













# Priority setting, sampling and testing

- The activity will set up a priority processing with a quick 'first choice' within power tools
- An estimated 60 samples will be sent for testing
- Cooperation with the ADCO Machinery group is foreseen; the MD does not distinguish between consumer- and professional use of machinery
